Nine months pregnant and caring for her little son, she was alone after her husband's arrest and facing harassment in her neighbourhood. Carlo Bhavan rescued her, offering safety and support, restored her dignity. After her husband's release, the staff accompanied her and helped reintegrate with her family.



Mrs. Revathi (48)

Found at the Amman Temple in Gummidipoondi, mentally disturbed and suffering from a severe skin condition, she was brought to Carlo Bhavan. With care, protection and treatment her health improved, and she has been joyfully reintegrated with her family. She is being given continuous follow-up care.

Carlo Bhavan is a destitute home in Kuruvattucherry village, just 2 km from Gummidipoondi railway station in Thiruvallur District, Tamil Nadu. It serves as a refuge for women who are mentally ill, vulnerable, abused or abandoned, offering them safety, dignity, and compassionate care.

Established during the COVID-19 pandemic, the Home emerged as a timely response to the rising number of women in distress. Today, Carlo Bhavan continues its mission of healing and hope, creating a nurturing environment where every woman has the opportunity to rebuild her life.

Our Support Programs

1. Rescuing Women



We rescue mentally ill and wandering women from the streets and bring them safely to the Home.

2. Integrated Health Care



We follow a holistic healing model focusing on physical, mental, psychological, and emotional well-being.

3. Empowerment & Rehabilitation



Through Skill-building, counselling, and daily routine we help restore dignity, confidence and independence.

4. Family Reintegration



Whenever possible, we work to reconnect women with their families and support them through the reintegration process.

When lives break, Carlo Bhavan becomes a place of healing. Every day, women and children in crisis arrive alone, frightened, abandoned, or unsafe. Some come without a name or a home; others arrive wounded in body and spirit.
